PLAINTIFF'S EX PARTE MOTION TO EXTEND TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER

Pursuant to Rule 65(b)(2) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure and the Court's inherent power to effectuate its own orders, Plaintiff moves to extend the Sealed Temporary Restraining Order entered by the Court on September 10, 2024 (the "TRO") (Dkt. 24) for a period of fourteen (14) days until September 24, 2024.

- 1. On September 10, 2024, this Court entered the TRO against the Defendants identified on Schedule A to the Complaint. (*Id.*) As of September 17, 2024, the third parties described in the TRO have received the TRO but have not completed effectuating the TRO by identifying and freezing all of the Defendants' payment accounts. (Declaration of John Haarlow, Jr. at ¶ 2, filed herewith.)
- 2. Rule 65(b)(2) states that a temporary restraining order entered without notice may be extended provided a party can show, prior to expiration of the order, good cause for such an extension. Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(b)(2).

3. There is good cause to extend the TRO because there is a high probability that the

Defendants will continue to harm Plaintiff without the TRO in place by moving assets contained

in the payment accounts of third parties to offshore bank accounts unreachable by the Court and

Plaintiff. As discussed in Plaintiff's Memorandum in Support of its Ex Parte Motion for Entry of

a Temporary Restraining Order, and as found by the Court in granting the TRO, this possibility of

harm is significant.

4. Accordingly, the good cause standard of Rule 65(b)(2) is satisfied and the Court

should extend the TRO.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff respectfully requests that the Court enter an order extending the

TRO for a period of fourteen (14) days until October 8, 2024 and granting Plaintiff such other and

further relief as is just in the circumstances.
